Forgiveness

All religions

Forgiveness is important to many religious believers — seeking God/Allah's forgiveness, and forgiving others.

Forgiveness can Reunite People and Prevent Reoffending

- 1) Forgiveness means stopping being <u>angry</u> with someone who's done something <u>wrong</u>. It is very important for many religious believers. They believe God is <u>merciful</u> towards people who <u>genuinely</u> seek his <u>mercy</u> and that they should <u>reflect</u> God's forgiving nature in their <u>own behaviour</u>.
- 2) Many believe it's important to <u>forgive</u> criminals so they can be <u>reconciled</u> with the <u>community</u>. If they leave prison <u>isolated</u> from others, with <u>no job</u> and <u>little prospects</u>, <u>reoffending</u> might seem like the <u>only option</u>. Forgiveness allows <u>both</u> victims and perpetrators to <u>move on</u>. However, most religious people believe that <u>criminals</u> should still be <u>punished</u> for what they've done.
- 3) Forgiveness can be <u>shown</u> in many ways. <u>Lesser offences</u> no longer stay on people's <u>records</u> <u>permanently</u>, and there are <u>schemes</u> that give ex-offenders <u>skills</u> and a <u>job</u> when they're released.
- 4) Restorative justice is where an offender might meet people who've suffered because of the crime they committed. Actually meeting the people they've hurt can help offenders to realise the extent of the damage they've done, try to make up for their actions and discourage them from reoffending. It helps the victim to work towards forgiving the offender.

Christianity Teaches that Forgiveness Comes from Love

- Jesus taught that <u>God</u> is always ready to <u>forgive</u> and that Christians must <u>accept</u> that forgiveness, and forgive <u>others</u> in turn. The <u>Lord's Prayer</u> includes a verse about forgiveness (<u>Matthew 6:12</u>).
- Jesus told people to seek <u>reconciliation</u> in any disagreements <u>before</u> offering a <u>gift</u> to God at the temple: "First go and be reconciled to them; then come and offer your gift" (Matthew 5:24 NIV). He also taught people to forgive "not seven times, but seventy-seven times" (Matthew 18:22 NIV).
- 3) Forgiveness is closely related to <u>repentance</u>. Christians believe that God's forgiveness can only come when they <u>repent</u> of their sins (i.e. say sorry, and turn their backs on them).

Islam Teaches that Allah is Forgiving

- 1) Muslims can seek <u>retribution</u> (see p.60) for injuries, but they're encouraged to <u>forgive</u> instead. Whenever the <u>Qur'an</u> describes <u>punishment</u>, it talks about forgiveness too.
- Muslims believe that they must be <u>merciful</u> so that <u>Allah</u> will do the <u>same</u> to them on <u>Yawm ad-Din</u> (the Day of Judgement).

"But if you pardon and overlook and forgive - then indeed, Allah is Forgiving and Merciful." Qur'an 64:14

- They believe that wrongdoing should be forgiven if the offender is <u>sorry</u> and tries to <u>make amends</u>.
- 4) The Prophet Muhammad was forgiving, as told in the Hadith Muslims believe in following his example.
- 5) But some crimes are seen as so awful that forgiveness isn't an option, e.g. shirk (see p.17).

Jews Should Follow God's Example and Be Forgiving

- Jews believe that <u>God</u> is <u>forgiving</u> and <u>merciful</u>, so they <u>must</u> forgive other people too: "...for with the Lord is unfailing love and with him is full redemption" (<u>Psalm 130:7 NIV</u>).
- 2) For the festival of <u>Yom Kippur</u>, Jews ask for <u>forgiveness</u>, both from <u>people</u> they've hurt and from <u>God</u> (see p.34). Jews believe that you can only be forgiven by the <u>one</u> you've <u>hurt</u>, so God can only forgive a sin against God, <u>not</u> another person.
- 3) Jews should allow criminals to repent for what they've done and seek forgiveness:

"Let the wicked forsake their ways and the unrighteous their thoughts. Let them turn to the Lord, and he will have mercy on them, and to our God, for he will freely pardon." Isaiah 55:7 NIV
